BEAVERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT BEGINS ATTENDANCE BOUNDARY PROCESS FOR SOUTHWEST PORTION OF THE DISTRICT

As a part of the voter approved 2006 capital construction bond, the Beaverton School District has constructed new classrooms at Hiteon Elementary School to help relieve crowded conditions in elementary schools in the southwest area of the District. Eight (8) new permanent classrooms have been added to the Hiteon campus.

The District will begin a series of attendance boundary committee meetings in September 2009 to determine neighborhoods that will be reassigned to different school attendance areas effective September 2010. The series of meetings will involve the Nancy Ryles, Scholls Heights, Sexton Mountain, and Hiteon Elementary Schools. The meetings are intended to result in committee recommendations to the Superintendent for neighborhood reassignments; the Superintendent, in turn, will make his recommendations to the School Board no later than the December 14, 2009 Board meeting.

Attendance Boundary Review Committees, comprised of Local School Committee (LSC) members, elementary school principals and District central office staff will determine recommendations to submit to the Superintendent. The Nancy Ryles, Scholls Heights, Sexton Mountain, and Hiteon Elementary Attendance Boundary Review Committee will hold evening work sessions as scheduled:

Beaverton School District Budget Committee Seeks Volunteers

The Beaverton School District has three vacancies on the Budget Committee. These positions are in School Board **Zone 3** (School Board member Mary VanderWeele), **Zone 5** (School Board member LeeAnn Larsen) and **Zone 6** (School Board member Jeff Hicks).

The District schools represented in these zones are:

Zone 3: Bonny Slope, Cedar Mill, Raleigh Park, Ridgewood, Terra Linda, West Tualatin View elementaries; Cedar Park Middle, Sunset High and Terra Nova School.

Zone 5: Barnes, Beaver Acres, Elmonica, McKinley elementaries; Five Oaks Middle, Health & Science School and Merlo Station High School.

Zone 6: Greenway, Hiteon, Nancy Ryles, Scholls Heights elementaries; Conestoga Middle and Southridge High School.

Individuals interested in serving on the Budget Committee need to live in the zones they will represent. Zone maps are available on the District website under District>School Board>Members>Full Zone Maps. Candidates must also meet the following qualifications: be a qualified voter of the District, have lived in the District for one year and cannot be a Beaverton School District employee.

The Budget Committee reviews the District's budget and recommends needed changes. The Committee conducts business in evening public meetings held monthly between January and June. The Budget Committee also approves the Budget Document and forwards it to the School Board for adoption by the end of June.

Budget Committee members will be appointed by the School Board to serve three-year terms.
